Thank you to the Clean Energy Advisory Board, the Resource Network and everyone for joining us today for our last Clean Energy Advisory Board meeting of the year. I look froward to hearing the reports from our Working Groups and the progress accomplished to date. As many of you know, City of Atlanta joined the Capital Good Fund, Savannah, and Decatur to



submit a Georgia Local Government Coalition Application for Solar for All. Solar for All is the historic \$7B opportunity available through the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund. https://www.epa.gov/greenhouse-gas-reduction-fund/solar-all

Atlanta, Savannah, Decatur, DeKalb County and Athens Clarke County have been working collectively on various federal funding opportunities. The last few months, we have focused on building a statewide residential solar program (Georgia BRIGHT) with Capital Good Fund. Georgia BRIGHT shaped the basis of our Solar 4 All application and program vision. THANK YOU to everyone that continues to work tirelessly to make sure Georgians reap the full benefits of the Inflation Reduction Act and for the 75 letters of support to date.

I am really excited about all of the work everyone has done this year through the Resource Network Strategy Decks, and the incredible work from the City of Atlanta "Sustainability Innovation Lab" building a Vision and Key Pillars, both place us in a good position to kick off 2024 with our broader communitywide engagement. The information lays the foundation to start developing a reimagined Sustainability and Climate Resilience "Action" Plan for the City of Atlanta that will launch in 2024.
